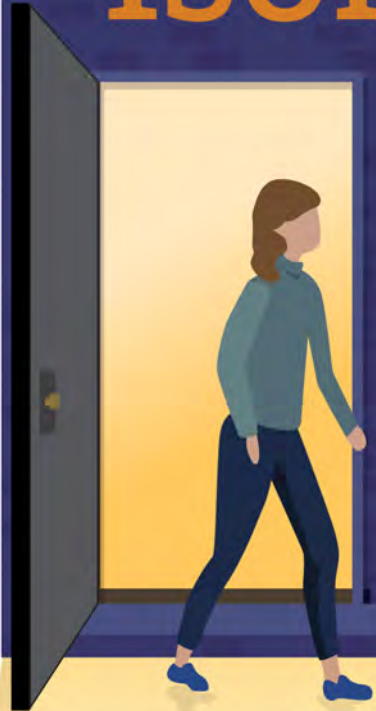

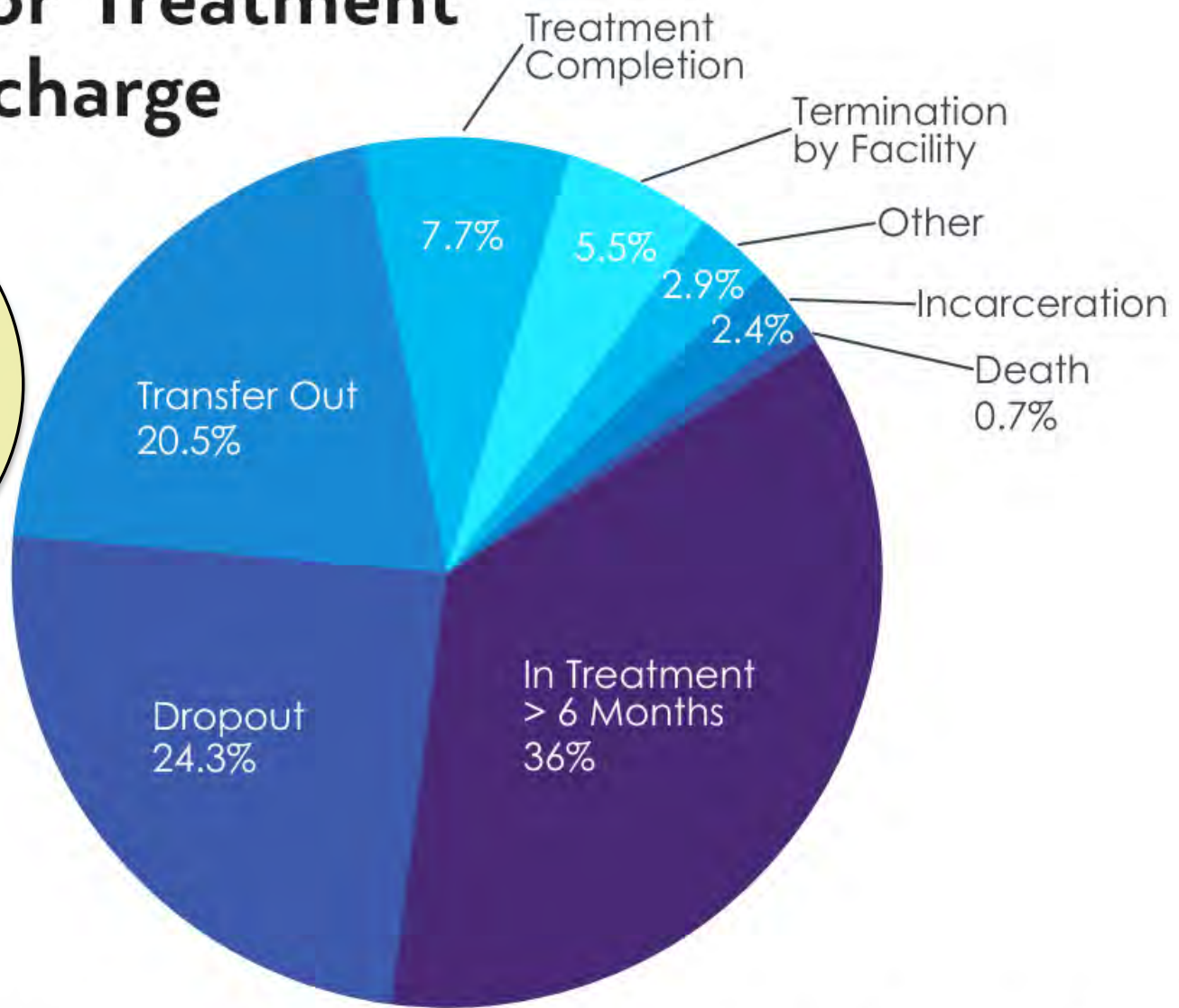

<b>More Likely</b> to <u>leave</u> treatment before 6 months	<b>Less Likely</b> to <u>leave</u> treatment before 6 months
Age 18 to 29 Age 30 to 39	Age 50+
Has experienced homelessness	Has not experienced homelessness
Co-using methamphetamine and opioids	Using only opioids prior to treatment
Referred by Criminal Justice System	Self-referred or referred by another person
Referred by School, Employer or Community
